**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO EXCEED PAGE LIMITATIONS REGARDING  
RECEIVER’S MOTION FOR ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE WHY HP DEBT  
EXCHANGE, LLC AND CHRISTOPHER GANTER SHOULD NOT BE HELD IN  
CONTEMPT AND BRIEF IN SUPPORT THEREOF**

COMES NOW Keith M. Aurzada, as receiver in the above-captioned matter (the “Receiver”) for James G. Temme (“Temme”), Stewardship Fund, LP, and all other entities directly or indirectly controlled by Temme or Stewardship Fund, LP, including, but not limited to Stewardship Advisors, LLC, d/b/a Stewardship Advisors, LP, Stewardship Asset Management Genpar I, LLC, Stewardship Group, LLC, Destiny Fund, LP, and Stewardship Management, LP (collectively, the “Receivership Entities”), and moves this Court, pursuant to Local Rule 7, for leave to exceed the page limitations in its Motion for Order to Show Cause Why HP Debt Exchange, LLC and Christopher Ganter should Not be Held in Contempt and Brief in Support Thereof (the “Motion”). Local Rule 7 provides that no motion may exceed fifteen (15) pages without the Court’s authorization. The Receiver’s Motion, which has been filed with the Court totals twenty (20) pages. The Receiver respectfully contends that additional pages in excess of the fifteen (15) page limitation are necessary to sufficiently set forth the factual background and legal analysis in support of its requests.

In its Motion, the Receiver requests a Court order requiring HP Debt Exchange, LLC and Christopher Ganter to show cause why they should not be held in contempt of certain order of this Court. In order to demonstrate the necessity of such relief, the Receiver was required to detail a complicated series of sales transactions and the Respondents' history of similar dealings. Due to these complicated factual circumstances, the Receiver respectfully contends that additional pages in excess of the fifteen (15) page limitation are necessary so that it may provide the Court with a thorough and complete argument in support of its request for relief.

Accordingly, the Receiver respectfully requests leave of Court to file its twenty (20) page Motion. The Receiver does not oppose an equivalent expansion of the page limitation for Respondents' response(s).
